Council President Oglesby further reported that he and Mayor Robbins went to Congressman Smith's office regarding the government housing project.

Mr. Oglesby also reported that the Public Safety Committee met with Lakehurst Police Association representatives which will be discussed in executive session.

Councilwoman Busch stated that the Youth and Recreation Committee was considering beach volleyball during the summer months and asked if the net could be left up at night.

Mayor Robbins stated that the Public Works Department can set up the net each day and take it down.

Borough Attorney Sean Gertner reported that he and Councilmen Lowe and McComas met with Mike Meriney of Excel Environmental regarding restoration of funding for brown fields grant for remediation of the former landfill site. Mr. Gertner stated out of pocket costs would be \$500 for the application fee and \$5,000 for a Licensed Site Remediation Specialist. Mr. Gertner asked permission to invite Mr. Meriney to the May 1st Council meeting to discuss his services in executive session.

Mayor Robbins stated that brown fields grants allow municipalities to seek funding for remediation of contaminated sites such as the former landfill site located on Proving Ground Road.

Mr. Meriney will be invited to attend the May 1, 2014 Council Meeting

COMMITTEE/COUNCIL REPORTS:

Councilman Davis reported that the members of the Public Safety Committee met with members of the Fire Department to discuss vehicle maintenance issues. Mr. Davis stated that fund raising issues and age of fire apparatus were also discussed.

Councilman McComas reported that members of the Finance Committee and the Chief Financial Officer have worked on the budget which was \$3.8 million in 2013 and \$3.9 million this year with a one cent tax increase generating approximately \$18,000 last year and a one cent increase generating approximately \$14,000 this year. Mr. McComas added that the committee members are working to "trim things down."

Councilwoman Busch reported that Inline should complete the water meter installation project next week with meter pits also being completed. Ms. Busch added that there are

approximately 36 vacant homes which will not be issued Certificates of Occupancy until the meters are installed by Public Works personnel.

Mrs. Busch also reported that the annual Easter Egg Hunt was well attended with beautiful weather for the event.

Mrs. Busch announced that the Youth and Recreation Committee has scheduled a Cinco de Mayo dance for Friday, May 2nd from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. at the Community Center for students in sixth, seventh, and eighth grades.

Mrs. Busch reported that the Orchard Street curb and sidewalk project has been started which is funded by a Community Development Block grant.

COMMENTS FROM PUBLIC:

Time opened: 7:47 p.m.

Sue Barker, 409 Cedar Street, asked about brown field grant for former landfill site.

Mr. Gertner replied that grant funding is available for to make the site viable and obtain a No Further Action letter concerning contamination remediation to remarket the property which is the largest vacant property in the Borough. Mr. Gertner added that the Borough will need to hire a consultant and pay a \$500 application fee and decide whether the costs associated with the project are worth getting the property on the tax rolls.

Mrs. Barker asked when the budget will be available.

Councilman McComas stated that the budget will be available in a "couple of weeks."

Bobbi Pratt, 703 Oak Street, stated that she picked up newspapers on Oak Street. Mrs. Pratt added that there are "a lot of foreclosures on Oak Street" and further added that "there is a lot of trash on the 800 block." Mrs. Pratt also stated that "code enforcement should be done by one person."

Mrs. Pratt asked which fire truck the fire company wants to replace.

Councilman Davis replied that there are a few plans which are being considered including refurbishing a truck and maintenance of a smaller fleet of vehicles.

Mr. Davis that the fire company is researching grants in an attempt to obtain funding.

Mrs. Pratt added that she wrote an essay to try to obtain funding for the July 4th fireworks display.

Patricia Hodges, 212 Cedar Street, asked why the discussion concerning the landfill grant representative will be discussed in executive session as opposed to the public portion of the meeting.

Mr. Gertner replied that the matter will be discussed in executive session as it concerns contract negotiations.
