COMMITTEE/COUNCIL REPORTS:

Councilman Lowe reported the Community Center oil to gas heating conversion has been completed and added that the chimney will be swept to final the permitting process. Mr. Lowe added that the F800 dump truck has been sent for plow installation.

Councilwoman Busch reported that the Youth and Recreation committee had a meeting on October 6th where upcoming activities were planned. Mrs. Busch added that a game night has been scheduled for November 14th and a winter bingo in January along with a movie night in February. Mrs. Busch further reported that the Halloween parade is scheduled for October 25th at 11:00 a.m. to be followed by a hayride and pumpkin patch and chili cook-off at Lake Horicon. Mrs. Busch also reported that the annual rabies clinic is scheduled for November 1 from 9:00 a.m. to 12 noon at the former fire truck bays.

Mrs. Busch also reported that new fans have been installed in the Community Center and a plow was installed on the Freightliner.

Janie Baranyay, 408 Cedar Street, asked Council President Oglesby the number of Special Law Enforcement Officers employed by the Borough.

Council President Oglesby replied that he didn't know.

Mrs. Baranyay responded that the Borough employs seven special officers and added that the Borough is only permitted to have 25% of police officers as special officers and have violated "Title 40A" and distributed copies of N.J.S.A. 40A:14-146.9 to governing body members and the municipal clerk.

Mrs. Baranyay asked if Police Officer Kline had been appointed as a police sergeant and if Officer DePasquale had been appointed as a certified police officer.

Municipal Clerk Dugan responded in the negative to both questions.

Mrs. Baranyay asked who puts information on the website.

Clerk Dugan responded that she sends the information to the webmaster.

Mrs. Baranyay asks who puts information on the police website.

Ms. Dugan responded that Police Chief Higgins places information on the police website.

Mrs. Baranyay stated there are discrepancies on the police department's website then distributed a copy of a page from the police department website listing officers and special officers.

Councilwoman Busch reported that she had visited the practice at Manchester High School last week.

Shanan Gilby, representative of Xtreme Action Cheer, stated that the group was requesting use of the Community Center one night a week and is also requesting to store the mats in the adjacent truck bays from October to May, 2015. Ms. Gilby stated that the group would return to the elementary school for practice in September, 2015.

It was suggested that the request be submitted in writing stating the Borough will not be responsible for their mats and that no basket tosses would be performed.
