Councilwoman Hodges reported that the Personnel Committee is still going over the AFCME contract. They will be sending to our Labor Attorney for review.

Mrs. Hodges added the Youth and Recreation committee will be having Family Game Night tomorrow night, 5pm to 8pm. They will also be hosting Zumba for Charity along with Nova Care on May 15th. All proceeds will to veterans suffering from PTSD. Nova Care is also hosting an Open House on May 1st.

Mrs. Hodges further reported that Ordinance Committee will be meeting up soon.

Mrs. Hodges stated that Mayor Robbins and herself had met with the members of the Lakehurst Revitalization Committee. At this point the committee is not moving forward. The remaining funds will be utilized to do something positive.

Councilman McCarthy reported that he attended the Board of Education meeting on March 26th. It was reported that funding was received to support the Pre-K program and the district has also been pursing additional funding to complement it. The Board approved two children for tuition free kindergarten pending availability in next year's class. The Superintendent was appointed the School Safety Specialist for the 2018/2019 school year, no mention of a stipend for this title.

Mr. McCarthy added that the Board approved several stipend positions, multiple field trips, building requests and the treasure report of March payment of bills at the amount of \$841,043.

Mr. McCarthy further reported the tentative budget was approved for the 2018/2019 school year by the Board Members for the total amount of \$9,609,985. Lakehurst resident school tax responsibility of the total budget is \$1,278,966.
