Council President Oglesby suggested the council meetings return to the Community Center now that the governor allows gathering of up to 25 people.

Mayor Robbins responded more tables can be added so the governing body can socially distance and added the chairs for the public can be placed 6 feet apart. Mayor Robbins stated if more than 25 people attend the meeting the governing body will have to turn them away.

Councilman DiMeo responded the borough can schedule a TEAMS meeting adding people will have the ability to join the meeting through TEAMS if turned away.

Mayor Robbins responded the governing body will open the community center allowing the public to attend the next the council meeting scheduled for June 18th and added the public can also attend via TEAMS.

Mr. Oglesby asked that Municipal Clerk Capasso advertise the community center will be open for the next council meeting.

Councilman Lowe questioned when all municipal buildings be opened to the public.

Municipal Clerk Capasso responded Governor Murphy is allowing all non-essential businesses to open on June 15^{th} with a 50% capacity and added beauty salons and gyms are allowed to open on June 22^{nd} .

Mayor Robbins responded the borough will open all municipal buildings on June 22nd.

Borough Attorney Ian Goldman responded he will reach out to other municipalities to see when they will be open and had ask Mrs. Capasso to do the same.

Council President Oglesby affirmative and commended the former recreation leaders for
an excellent job and their hard work over the years, Councilman Lowe affirmative,
Councilman Davis affirmative and also commended the recreation leaders for a job well
done over the years past and wished good luck to the new recreation leaders, and
Councilman McCarthy affirmative.

COMMITTEE/COUNCIL REPORTS:

Councilwoman Hodges commended both Eileen Robbins and Maryanne Capasso for their fine work as recreation leaders. Mrs. Hodges stated she worked alongside both for two years and added they were efficient and enthusiastic in all that they did. Mrs. Hodges also stated she appreciated all their hard work.

Councilman DiMeo reported the Youth and Recreation committee held their Chalk-it Up contest and added a few children did participate. Mr. DiMeo stated the committee gave each participant a \$5 gift card to Mrs. Walker's. Mr. DiMeo also stated the pictures of the artwork are on the Youth and Recreation Facebook page.

Mayor Robbins stated any pictures taken at the Youth and Recreation events can be displayed at Borough Hall.

Council President Oglesby commended Police Chief Kline for a "smooth and easy" contract negotiation. Mr. Oglesby stated both sides worked well together and added it was approved tonight. Mr. Oglesby also commended both the public works department

and the fire department for job well done with the clean up after the storm that came through yesterday. Mr. Oglesby went on to commend the residents of Lakehurst for coming out and helping their neighbors clean all the debris left behind.

Councilman Lowe reported the grass at the soccer and baseball fields is coming up nicely. Mr. Lowe also reported the footings for the dugouts will be put in next week and the dirt for the infield has been ordered.

Councilman Davis reported he hopes to report on the budget in the next couple of meetings now that Trenton is beginning to open.

Councilman McCarthy reported the Board of Education had a meeting this past Tuesday night adding the superintendent reported the summer programs will be limited this year adding they will be virtual. Mr. McCarthy stated any unused Title I funding that is reserved for summer programs will be used for "catch up" when students return to school in September. Mr. McCarthy also stated June 15th is the last day of school and added the graduation will be done in a "drive-in movie" format.

Mr. McCarthy reported public safety has been quiet up till yesterday adding they were quite busy and did an excellent job.

Mr. Davis asked if the Board of Education is better prepared then years past in regard to managing the building during the summer months.

Mr. McCarthy responded that the school is Building Automated Control meaning the school can be remotely controlled from any computer and added as long as the person operating the controls is sufficiently trained, the school will be good this summer.

MAYOR COMMENTS:

Mayor Robbins reported he received a letter from business owner Mr. Thomas requesting the borough to waive his second quarter taxes and to reconsider his water/sewer bill that is due. Mayor Robbins stated the borough will not be forgiving the tax bill and added Mr. Thomas can make payment arrangements in regard to his water/sewer bill. Mayor Robbins stated he will reach out to Mr. Thomas to inform him of the decision.

Councilman McCarthy asked if Mr. Thomas is making this request due to delinquent payments from his tenants or is he just simply asking his taxes and water/sewer be "forgiven" this quarter.

Mayor Robbins responded his tenants' businesses are closed due to COVID-19 and added Mr. Thomas stated the state said it is up to the municipalities whether they want to waive tax payments.

Mr. McCarthy responded Mr. Thomas can apply for a BPP Loan, Business Personal Property Loan.

Mayor Robbins stated he wanted to share the information with the governing body and added he will forward Mr. Thomas's email to them.
